



# Household Hazardous Waste (HHW), Electronic Waste (E-Waste) and Battery Disposal

Household Hazardous Waste, E-Waste and batteries cannot be processed at the City of Key West Transfer Station. The City of Key West has coordinated with Waste Management to hold drop off events at Indigenous Park, located at 1801 White Street, the first Saturday of the month from 8AM – 12PM. These events are free of charge to **RESIDENTS** with identification. Household hazardous waste products are often found in garages, sheds, storage areas, or under kitchen sinks. They can be corrosive, flammable, reactive, or toxic. Please make sure all liquids are in sealed, leak proof containers that will be left at the drop off location.

Below is a list of accepted items. This is not an exhaustive list.

## **Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)**

Adhesives.	Solvents.	Paint, Paint Thinner.
Stains.	Putty, Caulk.	Paint and Stain Stripper.
Drain Cleaner.	Pool chemicals.	Anti-freeze.
Hydraulic fluid.	Cleaning products.	Wood Preservatives.
Fertilizers, Herbicides, Weed Killer.		Pesticides, Rodenticides, Insecticides.
Fiberglass and Epoxy Resins.		Auto and marine maintenance care products.
Corrosives (muriatic acid, lye).		Roofing tar, sealants, patching compounds.
Fluorescent, CFL Light bulbs.		Grill and camping size propane cylinders
Gasoline, Diesel, Kerosene - Up to 5 gallons, MUST be containerized.		
Waste Oil (cooking, automotive, marine) Up to 5 gallons, MUST be containerized.		
Mercury containing items (thermometers, certain light bulbs).		

## **Electronics Waste (E-Waste)**

## **Batteries**

Lithium-Ion (Li-Ion).	Nickel-Cadmium (NiCd).	Nickel Zinc (Ni-Zn).
Nickel Metal Hydride (Ni-MH).	Small Sealed Lead Acid (SSLA/Pb).	

Common items that contain hazardous batteries, laptops, tablets, Bluetooth devices, power tools, remote car keys, vaping and e-cigarette devices, game controllers, digital cameras, portable power packs, singing, light-up greeting cards, electric toothbrushes, toys, medical devices, smoke, fire, carbon monoxide detectors, e-bikes, e-scooters, hoverboards, powered air fresheners.
